ROCK PIPIT *Anthus petrosus*

One February 2nd. Seven spring singles noted March 11th to April 29th. A total of 18 south October 2nd to December 6th with singles noted on site on six dates during this period plus two October 22nd. Also one later bird present December 28th.

YELLOW WAGTAIL Motacilla flava

A total of 38 north 150 south April 8th to May 20th, max. four north 21 south April 23rd with in addition singles noted on the reserve on eight dates during the spring passage period. Single later birds flew south June 2nd & July 1st. In autumn a total of 120 south August 12th to October 7th, max. 34 south August 29th with up to two birds present on site on ten dates.

BLUE-HEADED WAGTAIL M.f. flava

One May 14th.

GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea

One north March 31st. In autumn a total of one north 44 south plus two duos present on site August 26th to November 8th, max. five south October 1st.

PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba

Two pairs nested successfully in the dock edge and these birds plus their offspring account for a large proportion of records of birds on the reserve. A maximum of nine were noted on site March 10th. A total of seven north 12 south from March 15th to April 21st. In autumn a total of one north 432 south from September 5th to November 29th, with a maximum of 51 south October 13th.

WHITE WAGTAILS M.a.alba

Singles March 23rd to 25th, April 18th & 29th & May 13th.

WREN Troglodytes troglodytes

Six early in the year decreasing to five by March. Spring passage from March 12th to May 10th. A new female turned up June 10th. One pair bred successfully with first juvs. June 10th. Autumn passage September 21st to November 17th, max.15 October 13th & 15th with at least ten birds remaining into December.

DUNNOCK Prunella modularis

Present all year with c.12 pairs nesting. Spring passage March 5th to April 22nd. The first juvenile was noted May 20th. Autumn passage September to October 22nd. A total of 31 flew south September 28th to October 7th, with a maximum of 20 south September 30th a day on which an additional 50 were present on site.

ROBIN Erithacus rubecula

Eight birds successfully over-wintered. Spring passage was noted March 10th to May 8th, max. 15 April 5th. A late migrant was present June 4th. Two pairs bred successfully. Autumn passage from August until the last migrant passed through on December 2nd, max. 60 September 24th. Up to 12 were wintering on site at the year's end

NIGHTINGALE Luscinia megarhynchos

One April 12th, two 16th & one 17th, one June 14th & one August 18th.

BLUETHROAT Luscinia svecica

A first summer male of the race *cyanecula* present April 16th (Finders not known, R.A.Duncan, J.Lees *et.al.*).

BLACK REDSTART Phoenicurus ochruros

Spring passage March 13th to June 4th, max. three on April 5th & 16th. Autumn passage October 15th to November 18th, max. five October 21st.

REDSTART *Phoenicurus phoenicurus*

Singles noted on six dates April 14th to May 13th, plus two May 1st. Autumn passage August 3rd to October 15th, max. four September 10th.

WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra

Spring passage singles noted on seven dates April 24th to May 10th. Autumn passage August 23rd to October 2nd, max. three August 26th, September 2nd & 3rd.

STONECHAT Saxicola torquata

Three spring singles noted March 3rd to 13th plus a later single April 14th to 17th. In autumn singles October 21st, 22nd & November 21st.

WHEATEAR Oenanthe oenanthe

Spring passage March 13th to May 13th, max. 25 April 24th & 27th. Autumn passage July 21st to October 29th, max. 13 September 28th.

RING OUZEL Turdus torquatus

Singles April 3rd, 15th & 16th, September 26th & 28th, October 15th, 19th & 21st plus 21 October 22nd.

BLACKBIRD Turdus merula

Present all year with c.12 pairs nesting. Spring passage March 5th to May 14th with a peak of 25 March 13th. First autumn migrants from September 12th with stragglers noted into December with peak counts of 120 October 15th and 100 November 6th & 7th

FIELDFARE *Turdus pilaris*

One January 6th. Spring passage March 13th to April 29th, max. three March 23rd. In autumn noted from October 16th with 350 present December 19th.

SONG THRUSH *Turdus philomelos*

One overwintered. Spring passage began in late February to May 9th, max. five April 3rd. A handful of dispersing juveniles turned up June 9th to July 3rd. One August 19th preceded autumn passage from September 10th with stragglers still passing through into December, with peaks of 400 October 16th and 320 October 22nd.

REDWING Turdus iliacus

Spring passage March 9th to April 10th, max. 20 March 12th. Autumn passage September 24th to November 7th with a later two 28th, max. 6000 October 22nd. Small number also noted December 19th to 28th, max. 12 December 22nd.

MISTLE THRUSH Turdus viscivorus

Spring passage of eight birds February 12th to March 13th, max. three March 13th. One juvenile present May 29th. Autumn passage of 21 birds September 21st to November 10th, max. two.

SEDGE WARBLER Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

Three spring singles May 1st to 12th. Autumn passage July 13th to September 14th, max. four September 9th.

REED WARBLER Acrocephalus scirpaceus

Noted from April 23rd to June 28th, max. ten June 5th. In autumn singles August 9th, 28th, September 20th, two on both October 1st & 5th and one October 21st.

MELODIOUS WARBLER Hippolais polyglotta

One adult July 27th (P.J.Holmes, N.Odin).

LESSER WHITETHROAT Sylvia curruca

Spring passage April 18th to at least May 9th, max. six April 30th. One pair bred successfully. Autumn passage August 6th to September 19th, max. five on three early August dates but these include locals. A later bird was present October 20th & 21st.

WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis

Spring passage April 9th to at least June 5th, max. ten on eight dates. Four or five males sang with young produced from at least three pairs. Autumn passage from at least the end of July to October 16th, max. ten August 21st.

GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

Spring passage May 1st to 14th, max. four 1st. Autumn passage August 4th to October 31st, max. five September 20th.

BLACKCAP Sylvia atricapilla

Spring passage April 1st to June 26th, max. six May 1st. An unseasonal female was present July 13th. Several juveniles turned from July 29th indicating nesting nearby but not on site. Autumn passage August 29th to November 17th, max. 25 October 5th.

PALLAS'S WARBLER Phylloscopus proregulus

Two November 23rd (M.Ferris, M.Marsh, N.Odin et.al.).

WESTERN BONELLI'S WARBLER Phylloscopus bonelli

Male May 27th to 29th (N.Odin et.al.).

WOOD WARBLER Phylloscopus sibilatrix

Singles May 4th, August 3rd & two August 9th.

CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita

Spring passage March 13th to June 12th, max. 15 March 17th. A dispersing juvenile present July 22nd & 28th. Autumn passage September 5th to December 2nd plus a later bird 29th, max. 21 October 1st.

WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus

Spring passage April 1st to June 19th, max. 20 April 26th & 28th. A very young juvenile present June 28th & July 2nd. Autumn passage July 16th to October 1st, max. 15 August 8th.

GOLDCREST Regulus regulus

One overwintered successfully. Spring passage March 6th to April 25th, plus a later bird May 22nd & 23rd max. 25 March 17th & 20th. Autumn passage September 5th to November 15th plus a later bird 29th, max. 80 October 20th. A late fall of 40 November 7th was notable for late in the season.

FIRECREST Regulus ignicapillus

Spring passage March 13th to May 14th, max. three April 3rd, 13th & 14th. Autumn passage October 20th to November 14th, plus a later bird December 3rd, max. six October 20th.

SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata

Spring passage May 1st to June 9th, max. three May 8th. Autumn passage July 31st to October 1st, max three September 8th, 9th & 10th.

PIED FLYCATCHER Ficedula hypoleuca

Singles April 24th, May 8th & 13th. Autumn passage July 25th to September 12th, max. two July 30th & September 3rd.

LONG-TAILED TIT Aegithalos caudatus

In spring passage March 12th to 26th, max.eleven 12th. One June 3rd. In autumn ten October 15th, five October 16th, 15 November 17th & two December 16th.

WILLOW TIT Parus montanus

One April 22nd (J.Lees, et.al.), the forth site record.

COAL TIT Parus ater

Continental race birds *P.a.ater* in April were one 2nd, two 6th & three 22nd with two birds not racially identified but probably this race April 3rd. Single British race birds *P.a.britanicus* August 6th & 8th.

BLUE TIT Parus caeruleus

Small numbers present all year. One pair bred. Spring passage February 24th to May 14th, max. ten April 12th. Juveniles turn up on site from early June with passage continuing to November 4th, max. eight October 19th.

GREAT TIT Parus major

Present all year with two pairs nesting but failing. Spring passage March 5th to April 19th, max. 32 March 12th. A few juveniles turn up on site in June and early July. Autumn passage September 10th to November 1st, max. eight October 15th.

JAY Garrulus glandarius

One May 1st.

MAGPIE Pica pica

Present all year with one pair nesting but failing. Spring max. of eight March 9th and 12 September 30th later in the year.

JACKDAW Corvus monedula

In spring a total of four north and 20 south March 12th to May 6th, max. ten south May 6th. In autumn a total of six south on five dates September 22nd to November 17th.

ROOK Corvus frugilegus

Spring passage of two north and 20 south March 9th to April 29th, max. seven south March 9th. Up to three present on site on five April dates. Autumn passage totalling 28 south and one in off the sea September 7th to November 14th, max. eleven south September 25th.

CARRION CROW Corvus corone

Present all year with the local pair rearing three young on the dock lighting towers. Intruders occasionally turn up on site and are soon seen off by the locals. Spring passage movements of seven north, 70 south and four in off the sea March 9th to May 7th, max. 10 south March 27th. Two flew north July 22nd & one south August 15th. Visible movements in autumn totalling two north, 19 south, four in off the sea September 21st to October 26th, max. eight south October 6th.

STARLING Sturnus vulgaris

Present all year with at least five pairs nesting. The early year maximum was 150 January 1st. Spring numbers peaked at 1000 March 22nd. 800 were on site May 22nd and 2000 roosted at the end of August & in early September. Visible movements noted September 23rd to November 24th with a total of 4167 noted coming in off the sea or flying south, max. 1328 in off the sea November 2nd.

HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

Present all year with a speculated 30 pairs nesting. The years peak count was just 70 in September. A male which was presumably a hybrid House X Tree Sparrow sang from the cottage garage in spring, was ringed and had presumably been ringed as a juvenile House Sparrow the previous autumn.

TREE SPARROW Passer montanus

Singles noted on 14 dates March 30th to May 18th with two May 12th & three May 17th. The bulk of these records refer to a bird first trapped the previous May. Later in the year singles on five dates August 29th to October 19th plus three north November 4th.

CHAFFINCH Fringilla coelebs

One to two noted early and late in the year. A total of 23 south March 12th to April 1st plus two north May 1st. Spring max. of grounded birds seven March 9th. None were recorded June 11th to September 8th. Autumn passage September 9th into December with a total of 1531 south/in off the sea, max. 310 in off the sea November 2nd on which date 85 were also on site.

BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla

Spring passage March 18th to April 30th, max. three April 23rd. Autumn passage October 4th to November 8th, max. five on October 6th & 20th.

SERIN Serinus serinus

One north April 9th(N.Odin, et.al.) & one female May 1st (P.J.Holmes, M.James, J.Lees, B.Mackie, D.Nevit, S.H.Piotrowski, et.al.).

GREENFINCH Carduelis chloris

Present all year but none nesting on site and up to 50 birds daily feeding on site late summer. The highest spring count was just 15 apart from 58 south March 25th. Visible migration noted in autumn with 2773 south September 17th to November 27th, max. 429 south October 26th.

GOLDFINCH Carduelis carduelis

Present all year although very few noted in the winter months. None bred on site. Visible migration in spring totalled 1245 south March 13th to June 9th, max. 249 south April 29th. Up to 20 noted feeding on site in the late summer and 40 in the autumn. Visible passage movements totalling 5281 south August 28th to December 6th, max. 499 south October 14th.

SISKIN Carduelis spinus

Spring passage totalling three north eight south plus four singles present March 13th to May 17th. In autumn a total of one north, 109 south & three singles on site September 20th to November 27th, max. 25 south September 25th.

LINNET Carduelis cannabina

23 January 19th was the only record until February 22nd. An estimated 45 - 50 pairs nested. In spring a total of 491 south March 9th to May 1st, max. 149 south April 23rd. Up to 150 were on site late July & early August. In autumn a total of 4282 south September 5th to November 30th, max. 483 south October 14th. None were seen in December.

LESSER REDPOLL Carduelis cabaret

One April 28th. In autumn a total of 145 south plus ten individuals on site September 30th to November 21st, max.31 south October 10th.

BULLFINCH Pyrrhula pyrrhula

Singles April 26th & November 17th.

HAWFINCH Coccothraustes coccothraustes

Singles April 18th & 28th.

SNOW BUNTING *Plectrophenax nivalis*

One February 14th & in November one 9th, 15 24th & one 30th.

YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

A total of one north, ten south plus four singles on site March 7th to April 10th plus one later bird May 5th. In autumn only seven south plus one present October November 1st to 8th.

REED BUNTING Emberiza schoeniclus

Spring singles March 24th & April 29th. A total of 36 south & six individuals on site October 1st to November 20th, max. nine south October 14th.

CORN BUNTING Miliaria calandra

One May 6th to 7th & one south November 29th.
