One May 24th (N.Odin, O.R.Slessor et al)

LEACH'S PETREL Oceanodroma leucorhoa

One south September 6th (K.Leighton, O.R.Slessor, J.Zantboer et al).

GANNET *Morus bassanus*

One north February 26th. In March two north three south 11th & nine north 18th. A total of 14 north six south May 1st to 29th. A total of 60 north 18 south August 8th to November 2nd, max. 15 north one south October 15th.

CORMORANT Phalacrocorax carbo

Present all year with counts in single figures although the turnover of individuals moving about or loitering in the area makes data collected difficult to interpret. Double figure movements were ten north four south March 22nd, twelve south August 15th & eight south two in off 16th, three north 14 south September 16th, 16 south October 11th, three south eleven out November 3rd & two south 14 out December 30th.

LITTLE EGRET Egretta garzetta

One south April 25th, three south May 23rd, one south August 20th, two in off September 2nd & four in off 8th, one south October 2nd, two south 12th, one south 25th & one south 31st, one south November 2nd, one in off 3rd & one south 16th.

GREY HERON Ardea cinerea

One north March 7th. Autumn movements totalling three north, six south & two in off on eight dates August 3rd to November 8th.

MUTE SWAN Cygnus olor

Noted on eight scattered dates, max. five south November 12th.

PINK-FOOTED GOOSE *Anser brachyrhynchus*

In October 14 south 10th & two south and in 14th.

KESTREL Falco tinnunculus

Singles, occasionally two noted on site throughout the year but with very few records early in the year. Visible passage included singles in off April 27th, north May 5th & south August 15th & 29th & October 2nd.

MERLIN Falco columbarius

One May 5th. In autumn six singles noted October 5th to November 12th plus one south December 13th.

HOBBY Falco subbuteo

One April 23rd, two 26th with singles 28th, May 2nd, 16th & 21st, June 8th & 27th, July 1st & 21st, August 3rd & 22nd, September 4th & 19th & October 11th.

PEREGRINE Falco peregrinus

The adult female from 2005 noted again January 4th & 6th with possibly the same bird March 25th. A immature male noted April 22nd and probably the same bird May 7th & 9th, June 20th, 22nd & 27th, July 28th and on seven September and 19 October dates until being joined by an adult female November 1st. One or both of these birds were then noted on a further 30 November and December dates. Courtship display was frequently noted in November. Additionally in autumn a juvenile was seen October 12th and singles south offshore November 12th, 15th & 16th.

RED-LEGGED PARTRIDGE Alectoris rufa

Three birds at the start of the year increased to five April 3rd. One brood of chicks noted June 21st did not survive long. The population declined to four birds mid-November & to three from December 23rd to the years end.

OYSTERCATCHER Haematopus ostralegus

Up to four were occasionally on the reserve especially in the spring and summer with a pair attempting to nest unsuccessfully. Very few noted early & late in the year & none at all after December 11th. Very common all summer from mid-March to mid-November with large numbers nesting in the adjoining docks.

HERRING GULL *Larus argentatus*

Present all year with large numbers nesting in the adjoining docks. 200 offshore February 26th was largest count. Some small offshore movement is noted in the migration periods, max. 100 north March 22nd.

GLAUCOUS GULL Larus hyperboreus

Adult January 27th (J.Zantboer).

GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus marinus

Present all year although fewer noted in the summer months. One pair could be seen nesting on the dock roofs from the observatory. 44 December 11th was the peak count. Some small passage movements were noted in the migration periods.

KITTIWAKE Rissa tridactyla

Only seen erratically in the first winter period, max. 40 January 27th. None seen March 26th to May 7th. A total of three north eight south & one offshore May 8th to 27th. As is usual, there were raiding parties on the Holm Oaks and Sea Kale pods in the autumn peaking at 50 November 25th.

COLLARED DOVE Streptopelia decaocto

HOUSE MARTIN Delichon urbicum

Noted April 17th to November 5th, but with very few noted June 23rd to August 17th. Small numbers occasionally loiter on site, max. 20 July 25th. The peak movement was 1850 south September 6th.

TREE PIPIT Anthus trivialis

In spring a total of 13 noted April 20th to May 15th, max. three May 9th. In autumn a total of 15 noted August 23rd to October 12th, max. two September 5th & 24th.

MEADOW PIPIT Anthus pratensis

Seen all year but with very few in the winter months. Seven pairs bred. Seven south January 1st & two south 6th during a cold spell. Spring passage unimpressive March to late April, max. 25 April 5th & 15th. Autumn passage August 17th to November 29th plus a late bird south December 27th, max. 357 in/south September 27th & of grounded migrants 50 September 18th.

ROCK PIPIT *Anthus petrosus*

One January 4th & two 7th. A total of 19 south October 5th to November 19th with singles noted on site on three dates during this period plus two on three dates, max. two south plus two on site October 11th & three south November 9th.

YELLOW WAGTAIL Motacilla flava

A total of one north 56 south April 17th to May 29th, plus up to three noted on the reserve on six dates during the spring passage period, max. eight south May 5th. Autumn passage totals of two north 138 south July 21st to September 27th, with up to three birds present on site on seven dates during this period, max. 18 south September 4th.

GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea

Spring passage singles south on four dates & on site on two dates March 9th to April 7th with later singles south April 22nd, May 11th & 29th. A total of two north 59 south plus two on site August 1st to October 28th, max. seven south September 23rd.

PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba

One pair nested in the dock edge and these local birds account for many records of birds on the reserve. One January 28th was the only record prior to March 6th. A total of one north 15 south March 25th to May 14th. In autumn one south July 5th & two

south 29th plus two south August 8th preceded a total of 245 south August 23rd to November 14th, max. 25 south October 8th. None seen after November 30th.

WHITE WAGTAIL M.a.alba

Singles April 13th & 26th, May 5th & 10th.

WREN *Troglodytes troglodytes*

Seven birds successfully over wintered surviving from last year. Spring passage March 25th to April 26th with a new adult June 11th unusual, max. ten March 26th. One pair bred successfully rearing six young & two extra males over summered. Seven dispersing juveniles turned up on site from July 15th to August 16th preceding a poor autumn passage October 10th to November 2nd plus a later bird 29th, max. five. At least five birds were attempting to winter later in the year.

DUNNOCK Prunella modularis

At least 15 birds successfully survived the winter on site. Present all year with at least ten pairs nesting. Spring passage March 2nd to May 9th. A later new adult May 27th was unusual. The first juveniles noted June 2nd with breeding success reasonably good this year. Many dispersing juveniles turn up on site from June onwards until the start of autumn passage from at least September 23rd to October 21st. One flew south October 12th. The autumn max. was 20 on several dates.

ROBIN Erithacus rubecula

Eleven birds successfully over-wintered. Spring passage March 11th to May 12th, max. twelve March 24th. Two pairs bred, both rearing one brood. Juveniles were out of the nest May 28th with several dispersing juveniles turning up on site from June 24th to July 25th. Autumn passage from at least August 11th to November 8th plus a later bird 28th, max. 50 October 9th. At least ten were attempting to winter on site later in the year.

NIGHTINGALE Luscinia megarhynchos

Singles April 21st & 22nd with singles in autumn August 15th & 24th.

WHITE-SPOTTED BLUETHROAT Luscinia svecica cyanecula

Male March 12th (K.Lewis).

BLACK REDSTART Phoenicurus ochruros

Spring passage singles noted on eleven dates March 27th to May 12th. Juveniles were noted June 21st & 22nd plus July 2nd indicating breeding nearby in the dock complex. Autumn passage singles noted on eight dates October 14th to November 5th.

REDSTART *Phoenicurus phoenicurus*

In April two 17th & singles 18th & 20th. A late spring female June 10th. A young juvenile present July 3rd to 4th. Autumn passage noted on eleven dates September 13th to 26th, max. five 16th plus a later bird October 13th to 16th.

WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra

Spring singles noted April 23rd, May 3rd, 9th, 15th & June 3rd. Autumn passage noted on 16 dates August 13th to September 24th plus a later bird October 16th, max. two August 23rd, September 14th & 23rd.

STONECHAT Saxicola torquata

One May 5th. In autumn singles noted on six dates September 19th to November 6th.

WHEATEAR Oenanthe oenanthe

Spring passage March 27th to May 29th, max. 114+ April 20th with other notable counts of 30 April 18th, 33 19th & 36 26th. Autumn passage August 1st to October 21st, max. ten September 17th.

RING OUZEL Turdus torquatus

In spring one April 18th & two 20th one of which remained to May 3rd. In autumn singles October 15th, 18th & 23rd, November 1st & 2nd.

BLACKBIRD Turdus merula

Present all year with seven or eight pairs nesting rearing very few young. Spring passage March 7th to May 12th with a later bird 25th, max. 25 March 26th, 27th & 28th. First juveniles noted from May 1st with dispersing birds turning up on site from May 29th to September 1st. Autumn passage September 23rd to December 3rd with a handful of later new birds noted in colder conditions December 20th to 26th with notable counts over 30 being 400 November 2nd, 60 3rd, 75 4th & 35 8th.

FIELDFARE Turdus pilaris

Up to two noted on nine January dates. Spring passage February 22nd to April 19th, max. three February 23rd. In autumn noted October 12th to November 10th with peak counts of 131 in off November 1st & 34 in off & seven on site 2nd.

SONG THRUSH *Turdus philomelos*

At least three over wintered with six new birds turning up January 14th to February 3rd. Spring passage March 7th to May 17th, max. ten March 27th. Seven dispersing juveniles turned up July 4th to August 5th. Autumn passage September 16th to November 28th, max. 54 October 12th. At least one was on site in December.

REDWING Turdus iliacus

Spring passage March 19th to April 15th, max. 45 March 26th & 40 27th. Autumn passage October 5th to November 11th, max. 71 in off & two on site November 1st.

MISTLE THRUSH *Turdus viscivorus*

Singles February 13th & 16th. In spring a total of seven birds noted March 20th to 26th. Autumn passage singles noted on eight dates September 22nd to November 1st plus two October 3rd.

GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella lanceolata

One August 23rd.

SEDGE WARBLER *Acrocephalus schoenobaenus*

Four spring singles noted April 25th to May 12th. In autumn two on both August 4th & 5th with singles 16th, 28th & September 16th.

REED WARBLER Acrocephalus scirpaceus

Up to three noted on twelve dates May 1st to June 25th plus six May 16th & four 25th. In autumn eleven singles July 25th to October 3rd.

LESSER WHITETHROAT Sylvia curruca

Spring passage April 23rd to June 2nd, max. six April 27th. A new adult July 6th was unusual. One pair bred successfully. Autumn passage at least July 28th to September 29th, max. five August 27th.

WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis

Spring passage April 15th to June 25th, max. 19 April 26th. Four pairs bred. Autumn passage start obscured by locally bred offspring but from at least July 23rd to September 30th, max. six August 15th.

GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

Five spring singles May 3rd to 12th. One July 28th preceded autumn passage singles on twelve dates August 22nd to September 26th plus two September 17th.

BLACKCAP Sylvia atricapilla

A female present at least January 14th to February 1st. Spring passage April 2nd to June 16th, max. twelve April 25th. Dispersing juveniles turned up July 6th & 27th indicating nearby but not on site with these dispersing birds present to at least

August 26th. Autumn passage September 1st to November 24th, max. ten October 16th.

YELLOW-BROWED WARBLER Phylloscopus inornatus

One October 2nd to 3rd (O.R.Slessor et al).

RADDE'S WARBLER Phylloscopus schwarzi

One October 10th to 12th (N.Odin, O.R.Slessor et al). Forth site record.

WOOD WARBLER Phylloscopus sibilatrix

One August 4th to 5th.

CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita

One February 23rd preceded spring passage March 25th to June 15th, max. 18 April 15th. Autumn passage September 5th to November 15th, max. 15 October 10th.

WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus

Spring passage April 4th to May 17th plus a later bird June 1st, max. 25 April 19th. One July 5th was unusual. Autumn passage July 28th to October 1st, max. 30 August 21st.

GOLDCREST Regulus regulus

Spring passage March 30th to April 20th, max. two April 8th & 20th. Autumn passage September 16th to November 19th, max. twelve October 18th.

FIRECREST Regulus ignicapilla

Spring passage March 28th to May 3rd plus later singles 25th, June 3rd & 4th, max. five April 6th. Autumn passage September 9th to 24th & October 15th to 18th, max. seven September 10th.

SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata

Spring passage on 15 dates April 27th to June 15th, max. six May 16th. Autumn passage on twelve dates August 16th to September 27th, max. four September 17th.

PIED FLYCATCHER Ficedula hypoleuca

Autumn passage singles on seven dates August 14th to September 24th plus two September 5th.

LONG-TAILED TIT *Aegithalos caudatus*

In spring one February 18th, two March 26th & one April 22nd. One August 8th was unseasonal. In autumn six October 30th with one remaining to November 4th.

CONTINENTAL COAL TIT *Periparus ater ater*

Four March 31st & in April one 2nd, two 3rd & singles 4th, 7th, 14th, 21st & 24th.

BLUE TIT Cyanistes caeruleus

Present all year with one pair breeding successfully. Spring passage March 7th to April 24th with later birds May 28th & June 7th, max. eight March 30th. Very few dispersing broods & juveniles turned up on site from June 23rd to August 6th. Autumn passage September 7th to November 11th, max. eight on six dates.

GREAT TIT Parus major

Present all year with two pairs breeding successfully. One February 13th preceded a very good spring passage of at least 410 birds March 6th to April 17th with at least 390 birds moving through March 25th to April 4th, max. 90+ March 30th. Dispersing juveniles turned up on site June 11th & 16th. Autumn passage very poor September 5th to October 13th, max. six September 10th.

NUTHATCH Sitta europaea

One juvenile June 25th (O.R.Slessor et al). Second site record.

TREECREEPER Certhia familiaris

One September 4th (O.R.Slessor et al). Eighth site record.

RED-BACKED SHRIKE Lanius collurio

Female June 8th (P.J.Holmes et al).

MAGPIE Pica pica

Present all year with one pair nesting rearing one young. Spring max. seven March 15th & 22nd and a max. of eleven September 30th later in the year.

JACKDAW Corvus monedula

One January 12th. In spring a total of eight north ten south plus five singles on site on 13 dates March 18th to June 10th, max. six north April 18th. In autumn one north seven south plus three singles on site on ten dates September 21st to November 2nd with an additional ten present on site October 15th & seven 16th.

ROOK Corvus frugilegus

Spring passage of five south on four dates March 25th to April 8th, max. two south April 8th. None in autumn.

CARRION CROW Corvus corone

Present all year with the local pair rearing no young on the dock lighting towers. Intruders occasionally turn up on site and are soon seen off by the locals with a spring max. 17 March 31st and 18 October 8th in autumn. Spring passage movements of 43 south plus six in off March 10th to April 29th, max. nine south March 31st. Visible movements in autumn of 15 south September 24th to October 28th, max. nine south October 3rd.

STARLING *Sturnus vulgaris*

Present all year with only seven or eight pairs nesting. The spring max. was 163 March 25th. First juveniles noted May 17th with a mid-summer roost of 1200 end July & early August. Visible movements in autumn noted September 19th to November 19th with a total of 1930 noted coming in off the sea or flying south, max. 1140 in/south November 3rd. In early autumn the roost peaked at 2,500 September 19th increasing to 5,000 from November 12th to December 14th after which the roost rapidly disappeared presumably as a result of predation by unknown predators.

ROSE-COLOURED STARLING Sturnus roseus

Juvenile October 2nd (J.Zantboer). Sixth site record.

HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

Present all year with a speculated 20 pairs nesting but rearing very few young. The years peak count was 88 roosting August 24th.

TREE SPARROW Passer montanus

Singles March 9th, May 10th, 11th & 14th. In autumn four August 27th, two October 12th & one 23rd.

CHAFFINCH Fringilla coelebs

One to two noted on site early and late in the year. Spring passage March 7th to May 23rd with two later birds June 4th & later singles 15th & 18th. Visible movements of 204 south March 25th to April 27th, max. 86 south March 31st & the spring max. of grounded birds eight March 30th. A handful of dispersing juveniles turned up on site from June 4th. One pair bred rearing one brood with several other pairs nearby. One August 19th preceded autumn passage September 9th to December 1st with a total of 1174 south/in off the sea September 22nd to November 26th, max. 447 south October 8th. Autumn max. of grounded birds was 20 October 8th.

BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla

Spring passage singles noted on six dates March 24th to May 8th. Autumn passage totals of 42 in/south & 84 on site September 17th to November 19th, max. 19 in/south November 2nd. A max. of 14 were on site October 15th.

SERIN Serinus serinus

One May 3rd to 5th (N.Odin, et al).

GREENFINCH Carduelis chloris

Present all year but with very few early in the year. One pair nested with several additional pairs nearby; breeding success poor. Juveniles first noted May 31st. Up to 20 birds fed daily on site in July & August. In spring visible migration totals of 118 south March 10th to May 6th, max. 25 south March 31st with the highest spring count on site eight March 27th. Visible migration noted in autumn with twelve south September 2nd preceding a total of 4395 south September 22nd to November 26th, max. 1610 south October 8th. Good numbers fed on site in October, max. 110 October 11th.

GOLDFINCH Carduelis carduelis

Present all year although very few noted in the winter months. At least one pair bred nearby. Visible migration in spring totalled 143 south March 25th to May 27th, max. 33 south May 5th. First juveniles noted June 23rd. Up to six noted feeding on site in the summer & up to 40 in autumn. Visible passage movements totalling 4635 south August 27th to November 30th, max. 855 south October 8th.

SISKIN Carduelis spinus

In spring a total of six north 45 south & one on site April 2nd to May 4th, max. 30 south April 24th. Mid summer singles noted June 10th, 16th & 19th with two July 5th. In autumn a total of 46 south plus one on site September 19th to November 18th, max. twelve south October 28th.

LINNET Carduelis cannabina

Five January 1st then next noted February 11th. An estimated 30 to 40 pairs nested with several more nearby. In spring a total of 241 south March 25th to May 6th, max. 120 south April 25th. First juveniles noted May 25th. Up to 100 were on site May to August. In autumn four south August 19th preceded a total of 1105 south September 2nd to November 26th, max. 430 south October 8th. Last seen November 26th.

LESSER REDPOLL Carduelis cabaret

Spring singles May 3rd, 5th & 8th. In autumn a total of 54 noted October 5th to November 29th, max. eleven south October 21st.

COMMON ROSEFINCH Carpodacus erythrinus

One September 17th (N.Odin). Seventh site record.

BULLFINCH Pyrrhula pyrrhula

One south April 18th.

HAWFINCH Coccothraustes coccothraustes

One south March 25th.

LAPLAND BUNTING Calcarius lapponicus

One south September 24th.

SNOW BUNTING *Plectrophenax nivalis*

Early in the year noted regularly up to March 9th, max. 21 February 9th. In autumn one south September 27th, four south October 7th, two south November 2nd with singles on site on seven dates November 22nd to December 19th plus two on December 30th.

YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

In spring one March 9th, two 25th and singles April 6th & 21st. In autumn two south on both October 30th & 31st with singles on site November 10th & 14th.

LITTLE BUNTING *Emberiza pusilla*

One October 18th to 19th (P.Merchant, O.R.Slessor). Third site record.

REED BUNTING Emberiza schoeniclus

In spring singles February 8th, two in off March 25th and one on site April 3rd. In autumn a total of 21 south, one in off & twelve on site September 18th to November 3rd, max. four south October 5th.

CORN BUNTING Milaria calandra

One April 23rd & one south October 25th.
