# **RED-THROATED DIVER** Gavia stellata

Early in the year noted on 17 dates January 1st to April 9th, max. three north 58 south & one offshore February 3rd. Later in the year noted on 19 dates September 21st to December 27th , max. twelve south November 30th.

# BLACK-THROATED DIVER Gavia arctica

Singles north January 13th, north then south plus another south 26th, south February 3rd & north 16th. Later in the year one south October 20th, two north November 1st, one north 18th, singles north December 9th & 10th.

# **GREAT NORTHERN DIVER** Gavia immer

One north April 29th. In November singles south 2nd & 7th and north 17th & 18th.

# **GREAT CRESTED GREBE** Podiceps cristatus

Early in the year two south January 30th & one offshore March 26th. One south June 21st. Early autumn records of singles south August 24th & September 12th preceded passage of five north 15 south & three offshore on twelve dates October 19th to November 17th, max. nine south November 17th. Finally one south December 14th.

# **RED-NECKED GREBE** Podiceps grisegena

Singles south January 23rd & November 1st.

## FULMAR Fulmarus glacialis

Five north January 3rd & one dead 4th then noted March 7th to September 5th plus a later bird November 1st with the largest movement 25 north May 25th.

# **SOOTY SHEARWATER** *Puffinus griseus*

One south August 13th, one north one south 16th, one north 24th, one south September 5th & one north October 30th.

# MANX SHEARWATER Puffinus puffinus

Singles south May 25th, north August 24th, north September 2nd & three south 5th.

# BALEARIC SHEARWATER Puffinus mauretanicus

One north February 3rd (N.Odin). First site record.

# **GANNET** Morus bassanus

Three south February 3rd & four north March 8th then noted on 42 dates April 19th to November 3rd with notable counts of five north 42 south July 5th & 30 north ten south November 1st. In December singles south 2nd & north 27th.

# **CORMORANT** *Phalacrocorax carbo*

Present all year with most counts in single figures although the turnover of individuals moving about or loitering in the area makes data collected difficult to interpret. Counts over 20 were eleven north eight south 16 on January 26th, twelve north nine south two on 30th, 23 in off July 30th, 24 south one on August 12th, 21 south two on September 8th, one north six south 14 out one on October 31st

# SHAG Phalacrocorax aristotelis

In January two 3rd with singles 4th, 14th & 17th. One September 11th. In November one south 3rd, three 10th & singles 11th & 29th. Finally one south December 15th.

# LITTLE EGRET Egretta garzetta

Singles south March 3rd, south June 23rd, south July 5th, south 12th, eight north 13th, two south 20th, seven south 22nd & singles south 30th, out/north 31st, north August

8th, south 25th, south 26th, in off 27th, south 29th, in off October 18th, north November 21st & in off December 9th.

#### **GREY HERON** Ardea cinerea

In April one north 2nd & two out/north 3rd. Autumn movements totalling one north 19 south ten in off, one out & one heard on 19 dates May 27th to November 26th with peaks of five in off June 15th & six south September 7th.

#### **SPOONBILL** *Platalea leucorodia*

Two juveniles north September 23rd (S.Goddard, N.Odin et al). Sixth site record.

MUTE SWAN Cygnus olor

Noted on eleven scattered dates, max. three in off May 2nd.

WHOOPER SWAN Cygnus cygnus

Five south December 13th (W.E.Brame, N.Cant, E.Marsh et al). Sixth site record.

**PINK-FOOTED GOOSE** Anser brachyrhynchus

In January 36 south 22nd & two north two south 26th. Later in the year eight north October 3rd.

#### WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE Anser albifrons

Eleven in/north March 11th.

**GREYLAG GOOSE** Anser anser

One out/north January 24th. Local wanderers noted on 13 dates March 6th to June 24th max. seven out March 6th & seven in off April 3rd. Later in the year eight south August 8th & 17 south September 28th.

**CANADA GOOSE** Branta canadensis

One south January 9th then noted on eight dates March 8th to May 18th max. six south four on April 26th. 32 were sat in the river June 10th.

#### **BARNACLE GOOSE** Branta leucopsis

56 south February 8th, 94 south 9th, nine south March 3rd, eight south 12th, five south 13th, six south May 4th & 15 north July 28th.

#### **BRENT GOOSE** Branta bernicla

Last noted in spring June 2nd plus a later bird south 26th. First autumn record September 13th, max. twelve north 12,890 south October 30th.

Five south September 13th (A.Kettle, E.Marsh, N.Odin *et al*) two south 14th (P.Oldfield, N.Odin, R.Q.Skeen *et al*), one south 28th (N.Odin, E.W.Patrick, R.Q.Skeen *et al*) with three additional birds also on this date probably this species (E.W.Patrick, R.Q.Skeen).

## MARSH HARRIER Circus aeruginosus

Singles south January 30th, south April 29th, north July 23rd, in off 28th, south August 20th, three south 23rd, singles south 25th, south September 10th, four south 13th, singles south 14th, south 25th & south October 4th.

## **SPARROWHAWK** *Accipiter nisus*

Singles noted on 15 dates January to May 22nd plus two May 3rd. Noted again from August 5th to the years end with one or two noted on 89 dates plus six August 23rd, four September 13th & three October 11th.

#### COMMON BUZZARD Buteo buteo

Two south September 13th.

**OSPREY** Pandion haliaetus

One in off April 20th, five south September 13th & one south October 16th.

#### **KESTREL** Falco tinnunculus

One January 3rd & 4th was the only record early in the year after which one or two regularly on site from March 14th to the end of the year. In autumn a total of 18 in/south September 13th to November 15th, max. seven south September 13th.

#### **MERLIN** Falco columbarius

In spring singles noted on five dates March 29th to April 23rd. In autumn singles noted on eight dates September 9th to October 27th.

#### **HOBBY** Falco subbuteo

Singles on 18 dates April 27th to September 18th plus two May 16th & September 15th.

# **PEREGRINE** Falco peregrinus

Male regularly noted January to April 5th, May 6th, 19th, 23rd & June 16th returning August 25th and then noted regularly up to the years end. Additionally a female noted March 17th, a juvenile male April 4th, one in off April 20th, one in off August 25th, female in off September 12th & a juvenile male in off October 23rd.

#### **RED-LEGGED PARTRIDGE** Alectoris rufa

Two present all year.

#### **PHEASANT** *Phasianus colchicus*

Males noted on a date between February 18th and 22nd, March 4th & 18th to 19th.

#### WATER RAIL Rallus aquaticus

Singles March 15th, 26th, two 27th & one April 26th.

**MOORHEN** Gallinula chloropus

One October 27th to November 1st.

#### **OYSTERCATCHER** *Haematopus ostralegus*

Up to four were occasionally on the reserve especially in the spring and summer. None nested. Autumn movements from at least June onwards to December 13th with the years highest movement 70 south August 8th.

LITTLE GULL Hydrocoloeus minutus

Three south April 21st, one 30th, two July 20th, three south August 24th, one September 6th, two north 14th, two November 1st, 15 south 2nd, one south 7th & one north 24th.

SABINE'S GULL Xema sabini

Juvenile north November 1st (L.G.Woods et al). Ninth site record.

ROSS'S GULL Rhodostethia rosea

The record in the 2007 report was rejected by BBRC & should be deleted.

BLACK-HEADED GULL Chroicocephalus ridibundus

Present throughout the year with a peak count of 210 May 12th. Some small southerly movements noted at passage times with incoming passage in autumn from at least July 13th & three figure southerly movements of 237 south August 24th, 404 south October 25th, 100 south 27th & 177 south 28th.

**COMMON GULL** Larus canus

Present almost all year although only three records from May 27th to July 20th, max. 3,000 January 10th early in the year & later on 1,250 December 25th. First juvenile noted August 7th. Only very small numbers are noted moving at passage times, max. twelve south October 2nd.

#### LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus fuscus

Present all year although only in small numbers early & late in the year. Very common all summer from mid-March to November due to nesting in the adjoining docks.

## YELLOW-LEGGED GULL Larus michahellis

Adult January 3rd, second-winter 24th, adult 29th, adult plus third-winter 31st, adult February 3rd, first-winter April 16th & first-winter October 6th to 7th.

## HERRING GULL Larus argentatus

Present all year due to nesting in the adjoining docks. 2500 January 18th was the largest count. Some small offshore movement is noted in the migration periods.

## **CASPIAN GULL** Larus cachinnans

First-winter March 23rd (E.W.Patrick, R.Q.Skeen), second-winter April 2nd (J.Zantboer), first-winter April 17th (N.Odin, J.Zantboer), first-summer 27th (E.W.Patrick), second-winter October 19th (P.J.Holmes, M.James, N.Odin *et al*), three first-winters December 8th (N.Odin) & one first-winter 25th (N.Odin). The fifth to thirteenth individuals noted at Landguard.

**ICELAND GULL** *Larus glaucoides* 

Adult January 23rd (J.Zantboer)

**GLAUCOUS GULL** *Larus hyperboreus* 

First-winter January 10th (M.Marsh N.Odin). Same as December 2007.

**GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL** Larus marinus

Present all year although very few noted in the summer months. 150 January 10th, 29th & February 6th were the peak counts. Some small passage movements were noted in the migration periods.

#### KITTIWAKE Rissa tridactyla

Early in the year regularly noted up to February 21st, max. 750 January 15th. Very few noted February 22nd to May 4th & none at all 5th to October 24th except for singles August 17th & September 16th. From October 25th numbers increased with a peak count of 200 December 13th.

#### **SANDWICH TERN** *Sterna sandvicensis*

Noted April 13th to September 24th with a peak count of 23 out/north August 3rd. Small numbers occasionally feed offshore & in the river mouth, max. eight August 6th & 7th.

#### STOCK DOVE Columba oenas

Up to five noted on site all year. In spring two south May 11th. In autumn one south October 26th & 11 south 28th preceded a total of 711 south November 9th to 19th, max. 260 south 12th.

#### **WOODPIGEON** Columba palumbus

Up to 30 present all year with at least five pairs nesting. A total of 41 north 1230 south noted on 22 dates March 11th to June 27th, max. 352 south April 2nd. A total of 29,104 south on 20 dates September 29th to November 19th, max. 15,621 south October 28th.

#### **COLLARED DOVE** *Streptopelia decaocto*

Present all year with two pairs nesting. Extra birds are often present on site with birds roosting on site peaking at nine May 11th.

## **TURTLE DOVE** *Streptopelia turtur*

A total of 14 noted May 7th to June 17th, max. four south May 31st. In autumn singles September 14th & 20th.

Singles October 31st, November 13th & 28th.

#### **WREN** *Troglodytes troglodytes*

Seven birds over wintered surviving from last year. A very light spring passage March 18th to May 31st. Three pairs bred successfully. Dispersing juveniles from elsewhere turned up on site from June to August 24th. Autumn passage also very light September 20th to November 12th, max. 15 November 5th. At least eight birds were attempting to winter later in the year.

#### **DUNNOCK** Prunella modularis

At least 13 birds successfully survived the winter on site. Present all year with at least twelve pairs nesting. Spring passage February 28th to May 10th with a later new adult

May 28th. The first juveniles noted May 30th. Many dispersing juveniles turned up on site from June to August 15th. Autumn passage from at least September 8th to October 15th. Six flew inland September 26th & one south October 17th. The autumn max. was 30 September 26th.

## **ROBIN** Erithacus rubecula

At least nine birds successfully over-wintered on site. Spring passage March 9th to May 10th with later adults May 28th, 29th & June 13th, max. 15 March 17th. One pair bred. Several dispersing juveniles turned up on site from June 9th to 20th. Autumn passage from July 22nd to November 18th, max. 100 September 25th with a later arrival of 60 October 30th. At least eight were attempting to winter on site later in the year.

Present all year with c.15 pairs nesting. Two new birds turned up February 9th & 13th. Spring passage February 23rd to May 8th with later new adults 21st, 31st & June 1st (two), 6th & 14th, max. 30 March 30th & 31st. First juveniles noted from May 5th with dispersing juveniles turning up on site from May 18th to August 28th. Autumn passage poor September 14th to November 30th, max. 50 October 30th & 31st & 100 November 23rd.

#### FIELDFARE Turdus pilaris

One January 8th & two 10th. Spring passage March 9th to April 20th, max. five March 27th. In autumn one September 25th preceded passage October 16th to December 23rd, max. 91 October 28th.

#### SONG THRUSH Turdus philomelos

At least one over wintered. Spring passage February 14th to April 28th plus a later new bird May 10th, max. ten April 20th. One pair bred with another just outside the recording area. Two dispersing juveniles turned up June 21st & August 30th. Autumn passage September 16th to December 4th, max. 70 September 25th. At least two were wintering on site in December.

**REDWING** *Turdus iliacus* 

Spring passage March 3rd to April 22nd, max. 100 March 9th. Autumn passage September 25th to November 29th plus a couple of later birds December 23rd & 24th, max. 65 October 28th.

MISTLE THRUSH Turdus viscivorus

In spring one south April 5th. Two present June 1st. Autumn passage of up to two noted on ten dates September 8th to November 12th.

**GRASSHOPPER WARBLER** Locustella naevia

Singles April 20th, August 27th & September 12th.

**SEDGE WARBLER** *Acrocephalus schoenobaenus* 

Five spring singles noted April 5th to June 3rd plus two April 20th. In autumn singles on seven dates August 15th to September 22nd.

MARSH WARBLER Acrocephalus palustris

# **LESSER WHITETHROAT** Sylvia curruca

Spring passage April 12th to June 4th plus a later new bird 23rd, max. twelve May 1st. One pair bred just outside the recording area. Autumn passage July 31st to October 4th, max. five August 13th.

#### WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis

Spring passage April 20th to June 10th, max. ten April 23rd & 28th. Three pairs bred. Autumn passage start obscured by locally bred offspring but from at least the end of July to September 27th, max. six August 22nd.

#### GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

Singles April 30th, May 1st then up to two noted on seven dates May 21st to June 1st. Autumn passage August 29th to September 27th, max. three September 25th.

In autumn eight September 26th preceded a total of 115 on ten dates October 17th to November 17th plus five later birds December 22nd, max. 23 October 29th. A record year & the best since 1983.

#### **BLUE TIT** Cyanistes caeruleus

Present all year, did not breed. Spring passage February 20th to April 16th plus a later new bird June 5th, max. five March 14th & April 4th. Dispersing juveniles turned up on site July 17th & 31st. Autumn passage very light September 3rd to October 30th, max. nine September 21st.

#### **GREAT TIT** Parus major

Present all year with two pairs breeding. Spring passage February 26th to April 13th plus later birds May 15th & 27th, max. 16 April 2nd. First juveniles from May 30th with dispersing juveniles turning up on site from July 3rd to 27th. Autumn passage August 30th to October 17th, max. twelve August 31st.

#### **GOLDEN ORIOLE** Oriolus oriolus

One 3rd June (N.Odin, R.Q.Skeen, L.G.Woods et al). Fifth site record.

## **RED-BACKED SHRIKE** Lanius collurio

Male June 4th & juvenile August 25th to 28th.

JAY Garrulus glandarius

One October 29th.

# MAGPIE Pica pica

Present all year with one pair nesting but failing. Spring max. eight March 7th & 11th and a max. of nine October 4th later in the year.

# JACKDAW Corvus monedula

In spring a total of three north 20 south plus four on ten dates March 8th to June 3rd, max. five south May 2nd & 3rd. In autumn 21 south on eight dates September 14th to November 15th, max. nine south November 13th.

## **ROOK** Corvus frugilegus

Spring passage totals of one north eight south on six dates April 3rd to June 9th, max. three south May 5th. In autumn singles south October 15th & 28th.

# CARRION CROW Corvus corone

Present all year with a pair nesting on site for the first time since records began on the DFDS tower but the chicks succumbed following a night of thunderstorms. An additional pair nested on the dock light towers rearing three young. Intruders occasionally turn up on site and are soon seen off by the locals with a spring max of twelve April 26th and eleven October 16th in autumn. Spring passage movements of one north 76 south on 14 dates March 3rd to May 5th, max. 19 south April 28th. Visible movements in autumn of 50 south on seven dates October 3rd to 27th, max. 21 south October 13th.

## **STARLING** *Sturnus vulgaris*

Present all year with only three pairs nesting. The spring max. was 200 March 15th, 175 south 45 on April 1st with a mid-summer peak of 1,000 August 8th. Visible movements in autumn noted October 9th to November 25th with a total of 8661 noted coming in off the sea or flying south, max. 3560 in/south October 30th. In autumn birds attempted to roost on the dock lights peaking at 700 October 23rd.

## HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

Present all year with only four pairs nesting and rearing very few young. The years peak count was 50 roosting August 15th & September 8th.

#### **TREE SPARROW** *Passer montanus*

In spring twelve south April 4th. In autumn one south July 23rd then a total of 14 noted on nine dates August 31st to October 28th, max. four August 31st.

#### **CHAFFINCH** Fringilla coelebs

One or two noted on site early and late in the year. Spring passage February 21st to June 4th plus later new birds 15th, 24th, July 1st & 10th. Visible movements of 148 in/south March 31st to May 4th, max. 120 in/south April 1st & spring peaks of grounded birds 36 March 19th Two pairs bred with a handful of dispersing juveniles from elsewhere turning up on site in July. Autumn passage September 1st to November 19th with a total of 1849 south/in off the sea during this period, max. 458 south October 25th. Autumn max. of grounded birds was 25 November 6th.

# BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla

Spring passage March 15th to April 29th, max. three March 29th. Autumn passage totals of twelve in/south & 30 on site October 6th to November 26th, max. six October 29th.

## **GREENFINCH** Carduelis chloris

Present all year but with very few early & late in the year. Three pairs nested with several additional pairs nearby. Juveniles first noted May 24th. Up to 50 birds fed on site end-July & August. In spring visible migration totals of six south March 29th to May 1st with the highest spring count on site ten on several dates early May. Visible migration totals in autumn of 3522 south September 28th to November 19th, max. 556 south October 13th. Up to 60 on site in October & November.

## **GOLDFINCH** Carduelis carduelis

Present all year with at least one pair nesting nearby just outside the recording area. Visible migration in spring totalled three north 46 south April 4th to June 26th, max. 14 south April 23rd. Four south July 18th & one south 19th preceded visible passage movements totalling 5752 south August 13th to November 27th, max. 893 south October 13th, with an autumn max. of grounded birds 40 October 7th & 22nd.

#### **SISKIN** Carduelis spinus

In spring a total of seven north 108 south eleven on March 9th to May 9th, max. 66 south April 1st with late spring & summer records of six south May 30th & singles south June 4th, 23rd, 25th & one on July 4th. In autumn a total of 39 north 783 in/south two on September 7th to November 17th plus two later birds south December 11th, max. 98 south October 11th.

#### LINNET Carduelis cannabina

One January 16th then next noted February 8th. An estimated 30 to 40 pairs nested with several more nearby. In spring ten south April 25th was only visible migration noted. First juveniles noted May 18th. Up to 100 were regularly on site end-April to September with occasional higher counts, max. 150 August 3rd. In autumn a total of 582 south September 28th to November 12th, max. 115 south October 13th. Only records after November 14th were one 26th & four December 14th.

# **LESSER REDPOLL** Carduelis cabaret

In spring two south April 27th, one south May 3rd, two north 27th & one north 29th (although the timing of these late spring birds during easterly winds suggests they might be "mealies"). One flew south July 31st. In autumn a total of 1520 noted September 20th to November 25th, max. 310 south October 16th.

## **CROSSBILL** Loxia curvirostra

Three south March 6th. A total of 222 noted May 28th to September 3rd, max. 30 south June 23rd. Finally nine south October 2nd.

## **COMMON ROSEFINCH** Carpodacus erythrinus

Singles May 29th (N.Odin) & June 4th (C.Fulcher). The eighth & ninth site records.

#### BULLFINCH Pyrrhula pyrrhula

One October 15th.

HAWFINCH Coccothraustes coccothraustes

Females April 20th (Essex birdwatching society et al) & May 29th (R.Q.Skeen et al).

LAPLAND BUNTING Calcarius lapponicus

One south October 6th (D.T.Langlois, N.Odin).

**SNOW BUNTING** *Plectrophenax nivalis* 

In spring singles March 16th, 27th & two 29th. In autumn singles noted on five dates October 28th to November 22nd plus two 29th.

#### YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

In spring two south February 22nd & singles south March 5th, 17th & April 26th. One south July 19th. In autumn singles south October 4th, 22nd, on November 5th & south 12th & 27th..

**ORTOLAN BUNTING** Emberiza hortulana

One south September 19th (J.Zantboer).

**RUSTIC BUNTING** *Emberiza rustica* 

One September 23rd to 24th (R.Q.Skeen et al). Second site record.

**REED BUNTING** Emberiza schoeniclus

In March singles 8th, 12th, four south 13th & one 16th. In autumn a total of 16 south & four on site September 15th to October 18th plus a late bird December 5th, max. five south October 9th.
