JACKDAW Corvus monedula

In spring a total of six north nine south plus five on 13 dates February 22nd to June 3rd, max. two. In autumn 15 south plus one in off on seven dates September 23rd to November 7th, max. four south October 19th & 26th.

ROOK Corvus frugilegus

Spring passage totals of five north 17 south plus four on nine dates February 28th to March 28th plus a later bird south May 2nd, max. seven south March 14th. In autumn one south October 18th, four north three south 23rd, one south 28th & one south 29th.

CARRION CROW Corvus corone

Present all year. Two pairs nested in the adjoining docks rearing three plus one young. Intruders occasionally turn up on site and are soon seen off by the locals with a spring max of ten April 16th and 17 October 28th in autumn. Spring passage movements of seven north 61 south plus three in off on 17 dates March 2nd to May 10th, max. 13 south April 12th. Visible movements in autumn of 17 south plus one in off on eight dates September 28th to October 26th, max. six south October 14th.

GOLDCREST Regulus regulus

Spring passage March 14th to April 20th, max. five March 17th & 19th. Autumn passage very poor with one September 14th then from October 12th to 24th, max. five 15th.

FIRECREST Regulus ignicapilla

Spring singles March 14th & April 21st. Autumn passage October 8th to November 5th, max. five October 9th.

BLUE TIT Cyanistes caeruleus

Present all year except April 21st to May 16th & May 18th to June 11th. Spring passage February 28th to April 20th plus a later new bird May 17th, max. two. Dispersing juveniles turned up from June 12th with autumn passage light continuing to at least October 28th, max. six on site August 16th & November 9th.

GREAT TIT Parus major

Present all year with two pairs breeding. Spring passage February 21st to March 22nd, max. six March 17th. First juveniles from May 28th with dispersing juveniles turning up on site from June 11th to August 20th. Autumn passage September 21st to October 31st, max. ten October 6th.

COAL TIT *Periparus ater britannicus*

Singles June 14th & 23rd.

CONTINENTAL COAL TIT *Periparus ater ater*

Three April 6th to 10th with one remaining to 22nd. One September 14th was probably this race.

WILLOW TIT Poecile montana.

One June 14th (G.Gregory, N.Odin). Fifth site record.

MARSH TIT Poecile palustris

One June 16th (S.Goddard, G.Gregory, N.Odin). Third site record.

WOODLARK Lullula arborea

One south October 26th & five south 27th.

SKYLARK Alauda arvensis

Up to three noted on 17 dates January 28th to May 26th. Autumn passage & cold weather movements September 27th to December 26th, max. 65 south October 28th & 79 south December 20th with a max. of grounded birds of up to four on four dates. Three flew north October 10th.

Noted from March 30th to November 12th. Spring passage noted up to at least July 2nd, max. six north 103 south May 3rd. Small numbers occasionally loiter on site, max. four. Autumn passage from at least July 10th, max. 1400 south September 7th.

RED-RUMPED SWALLOW Cecropis daurica

One south May 3rd (P.Oldfield). Sixth site record of seven birds.

LONG-TAILED TIT *Aegithalos caudatus*

Two January 21st & 16 February 19th. In spring a total of 29 birds on seven dates March 5th to 21st, max. 12 March 16th. In autumn seven September 26th preceded a total of 85 on nine dates October 15th to November 11th plus 3 later birds December 8th, max. 22 November 9th. The September flock returned on several October dates elevating the autumn totals.

GREENISH WARBLER *Phylloscopus trochiloides*

One September 17th to 18th (M.Garnham, G.Gregory, N.Odin et al). Third site record.

ARCTIC WARBLER *Phylloscopus borealis*

One September 1st to 2nd (P.J.Holmes et al). First site record.

YELLOW-BROWED WARBLER *Phylloscopus inornatus*

One October 23rd (J.Zantboer).

CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita

Spring passage March 16th to June 10th plus later new birds 28th & 29th, max. 12 April 4th. Two birds over summered from June 8th to December 3rd & June 28th to October 1st. Dispersing juveniles turned up June 14th, 23rd, July 2nd, 3rd & 9th.

Autumn passage August 25th to November 9th plus the later bird staying to December 3rd, max. 15 September 20th.

WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus

Spring passage April 4th to May 21st, max. 30 May 7th. Autumn passage July 25th to October 7th, max. 30 August 29th.

BLACKCAP Sylvia atricapilla

Spring passage April 4th to May 31st, max. four April 4th. Dispersing juveniles turned up June 26th, July 4th, 6th & August 9th. Autumn passage September 2nd to November 30th, max. four on five dates.

GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

Singles in spring on six dates May 9th to 30th plus five 13th. Autumn passage August 12th to September 26th, max. two September 7th, 16th & 18th.

LESSER WHITETHROAT Sylvia curruca

Spring passage April 13th to June 7th, max. five April 21st. One pair bred just outside the recording area rearing two broods. Autumn passage at least July 25th to September 30th, max. two apart from four July 25th which included local juvs.

WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis

Spring passage April 16th to May 25th, max. eight May 2nd, 7th & 23rd. Three pairs bred. Autumn passage start obscured by locally bred offspring but from at least the end of July to October 10th, max. six September 6th.

DARTFORD WARBLER Sylvia undata

One November 4th (T.Holland, D.T.Langlois, N.Odin et al). Fourth site record.

GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella naevia

One September 1st.

ICTERINE WARBLER Hippolais icterina

Different singles May 14th (W.Brame et al) & 15th (N.Odin et al).

MELODIUS WARBLER Hippolais polyglotta

Singing male May 17th (G.Gregory, N.Odin, E.W.Patrick *et al*) moved to the area north of the customs house next day (J.Zantboer *et al*). Eighth site record.

SEDGE WARBLER *Acrocephalus schoenobaenus*

In spring singles noted on five dates April 13th to May 18th. In autumn an early juvenile June 30th preceded singles July 25th, August 29th & September 5th.

MARSH WARBLER Acrocephalus palustris

Singles June 6th (N.Odin, G.Plank et al) & 11th (G.Gregory, N.Odin et al).

REED WARBLER Acrocephalus scirpaceus

In spring up to two noted on ten dates May 10th to July 4th plus four June 8th. In autumn singles on six dates July 17th to October 8th plus two September 19th.

WAXWING Bombycilla garrulus

One in off the sea December 13th.

TREECREEPER Certhia familiaris

Singles June 27th & September 24th.

WREN *Troglodytes troglodytes*

At least 14 birds over wintered surviving from last year. A light spring passage March 14th to April 25th. Three pairs bred with juveniles appearing from June 16th. Dispersing juveniles from elsewhere turned up on site from end June to August 15th. Autumn passage also very light September 19th to November 11th, max. five November 5th. At least five birds were attempting to winter later in the year.

STARLING *Sturnus vulgaris*

Present all year with three pairs nesting. 300+ noted January 6th. The spring max. was 120 March 18th & 19th. First juv. noted May 17th. Mid-summer peak of 1,500 August 4th. Eleven south September 19th preceded visible movements in autumn October 10th to November 26th with a total of 4343 noted coming in off the sea or flying south, max. 1827 in/south October 28th. In autumn birds attempted to roost on the dock lights peaking at 800 October 30th. Finally 13 later birds came in off the sea December 18th.

RING OUZEL Turdus torquatus

In April singles noted on 13 dates 6th to 29th plus two 13th with a later bird May 13th to 15th. In autumn singles September 23rd, October 13th & 24th.

BLACKBIRD Turdus merula

Present all year with 12 to 13 pairs nesting. Spring passage February 28th to May 3rd with a later new adult 24th, max. 40 March 21st. First juveniles noted from April 15th with dispersing juveniles turning up on site from May to August 5th plus a later bird 31st. Autumn passage September 27th to November 18th, max 136 October 31st with a handful of new birds December 1st to 31st.

FIELDFARE Turdus pilaris

Spring passage February 1st to April 24th, max. five February 6th. Autumn passage October 12th to November 24th with later singles December 13th, 30th & 31st, max. 300 in off October 27th.

SONG THRUSH *Turdus philomelos*

At least one over wintered with new birds turning up January 2nd, 5th & 9th. Spring passage February 23rd to April 21st, max. five April 17th. One pair bred at the northern end of the recording area. Two dispersing juveniles turned up June 12th & singles July 8th, August 6th & 12th. Autumn passage September 16th to November 12th with a later bird December 2nd & a small influx of new birds 16th to 28th, max. 35 September 20th & 60 October 31st.

REDWING Turdus iliacus

One February 1st. Spring passage March 2nd to April 14th, max. 22 March 12th. Autumn passage September 30th to November 30th plus two later birds December 16th & one 20th, max. 1,000 in off October 27th.

MISTLE THRUSH Turdus viscivorus

In spring singles March 1st, 17th, 22nd, April 3rd & 7th. One juvenile present May 21st. In autumn four in off September 20th, two October 5th, one 28th, one 31st, one November 4th, one 6th, one 10th, two 24th & one December 29th.

SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata

Spring passage May 7th to June 9th, max. ten May 13th. Autumn passage singles on 12 dates August 18th to September 16th.

ROBIN Erithacus rubecula

At least five birds successfully over-wintered on site. Spring passage March 5th to May 14th, max. five April 10th. None bred. Several dispersing juveniles turned up on site from May 29th to June 29th. Autumn passage August 6th to November 17th, max. 35 October 31st. At least six were attempting to winter on site later in the year.

NIGHTINGALE Luscinia megarhynchos

Spring singles April 11th & 14th & in autumn singles August 13th to 16th, 26th & 29th to September 5th.

BLACK REDSTART Phoenicurus ochruros

Spring passage March 16th to May 2nd, max. three March 30th, April 2nd & 4th. A later male present June 14th. In autumn singles October 23rd, 30th & two November 9th.

REDSTART *Phoenicurus phoenicurus*

Seven noted on spring passage April 4th to May 14th, max. two April 4th & 14th. Autumn passage August 8th to September 20th, max. five September 18th.

WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra

Spring singles May 9th, 14th, 15th & June 5th. Autumn passage August 24th to September 16th plus a later bird October 22nd, max. three September 5th & 6th.

STONECHAT Saxicola torquata

In March one 1st, five 12th & four 13th. In autumn one September 25th, two October 22nd & one November 6th to 7th.

WHEATEAR Oenanthe oenanthe

Spring passage March 14th to May 24th, max. 22 May 9th. Autumn passage August 5th to October 25th, max. 14 September 16th.

RED-BREASTED FLYCATCHER Ficedula parva

One September 14th (G.Gregory et al).

PIED FLYCATCHER Ficedula hypoleuca

In spring females May 14th, three 15th & one 16th. Autumn passage August 7th to September 21st, max four September 20th.

DUNNOCK Prunella modularis

At least 17 birds successfully survived the winter on site including one originally ringed in 2001. Present all year with at least ten pairs nesting. Spring passage March 15th to April 26th. The first juveniles noted June 2nd. Many dispersing juveniles turned up on site from June to August 14th. Autumn passage from at least September 1st to October 18th, max 28 September 24th. In September six south 21st, eight south 23rd & one south 28th.

HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

Present all year with three pairs nesting and rearing very few young. The years peak count was 182 roosting September 9th.

TREE SPARROW Passer montanus

None in spring. In autumn a total of 40 noted on eight dates August 26th to October 17th, max. 19 September 5th.

YELLOW WAGTAIL Motacilla flava

A total of three north nine south plus three on site April 6th to May 14th, max. one north two south April 24th & three south May 3rd. Autumn passage totals of one north 66 south plus 11 on site June 30th to October 26th, max. 11 south September 4th.

GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea

In spring a total of two north two south plus one on site March 6th to 25th with summer records of two south June 13th, one south July 1st & one south 23rd. In autumn a total of five north 65 south plus one on site August 29th to November 7th, max. five south October 12th.

PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba

One pair nested in the docks nearby and these local birds account for many records of birds on the reserve. None seen January to February 21st. A total of three north six south March 15th to 26th. In autumn a total of 431 south August 6th to November 21st, max. 37 south October 23rd.

WHITE WAGTAIL M.a.alba

Singles on five dates April 3rd to May 17th. In autumn one September 8th.

TAWNY PIPIT Anthus campestris

One south September 24th (P.Merchant, N.Odin).

TREE PIPIT Anthus trivialis

In spring singles May 2nd & 13th. In autumn eight noted September 14th to 27th, max. two 19th.

MEADOW PIPIT *Anthus pratensis*

Seen all year with seven pairs rearing several broods. Spring passage poor from at least February 12th to mid-April, max. 20 April 4th, 6th & 14th. Autumn passage from at least September 5th to December 19th, max. 212 south September 6th & 313 south October 28th and of grounded migrants 60 October 23rd.

ROCK PIPIT *Anthus petrosus*

One south January 15th. In spring singles February 28th, March 1st & 18th. In autumn a total of one north 15 south plus singles on site on five dates September 23rd to November 2nd, max five south October 29th.

CHAFFINCH Fringilla coelebs

Up to four noted on site early and late in the year. Spring passage February 28th to May 4th plus a later new bird May 28th. Visible movements of 60 in/south March 12th to May 4th, max. 20 south March 14th & April 4th & a spring peak of grounded birds five March 14th One pair bred but failed. None seen July 15th to August 29th. Autumn passage August 30th to December 5th with a total of 1334 south/in off the sea during this period, max. 160 south October 23rd. Autumn max. of grounded birds was 30 October 2nd.

BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla

Spring passage of six birds March 19th to April 14th, max. two April 14th. Autumn passage totals of 24 in/south & 22 on site September 25th to December 9th, max. six October 13th & 27th.

SERIN Serinus serinus

One south April 26th (N.Odin).

GREENFINCH Carduelis chloris

Present all year but with very few early & late in the year. Two pairs nested with several additional pairs nearby. Juveniles first noted May 20th. In spring visible migration almost non-existent with singles south April 8th & May 4th with the highest spring count on site just four. Up to 30 birds fed on site end-July & August. Six south August 4th preceded visible migration totals in autumn of 2318 south September 21st to November 26th, max. 296 south October 11th. Up to 100 birds fed on site in October & November.

GOLDFINCH Carduelis carduelis

Present all year in small numbers with at least one pair nesting nearby just outside the recording area. Visible migration in spring totalled two north 64 south March 16th to May 28th, max. 12 south May 3rd. In autumn visible passage movements totalling 5043 south September 1st to December 8th, max. 1502 south October 11th, with an autumn max. of grounded birds 80 October 11th.

SISKIN Carduelis spinus

In spring a total of six north 29 south six on March 2nd to May 1st, max. 13 south March 14th. In autumn a total of seven north 420 in/south September 11th to December 1st, max. 160 south October 26th.

LINNET Carduelis cannabina

One January 26th, 20 south February 7th, then noted regularly from February 11th. An estimated 30 to 40 pairs nested with several more nearby. In spring four south April 15th & six south 16th were only visible migration noted. First juveniles noted May 21st. Up to 85 were regularly on site end-April to September. In autumn a total of 1071 south September 21st to December 9th, max. 109 south October 28th. Only records after November 13th were 46 south 17th, 12 south 26th, six December 1st & two south 9th.

LESSER REDPOLL Carduelis cabaret

In spring singles April 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 20th. In autumn a total of 1045 noted October 12th to December 9th, max. 464 south October 26th.

COMMON REDPOLL Carduelis flammea

Singles October 26th & November 6th.

CROSSBILL Loxia curvirostra

Five north September 16th & one south October 26th.

BULLFINCH Pyrrhula pyrrhula

Two south October 28th & two south 29th.

SNOW BUNTING *Plectrophenax nivalis*

One February 12th & 14th. In November two 2nd, five 9th, one 12th, one 21st, three south 25th & one south 28th.

LAPLAND BUNTING Calcarius lapponicus

One south November 6th.

YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

In spring one March 3rd & one south 23rd. In autumn one north October 11th & one 29th.

ORTOLAN BUNTING Emberiza hortulana

An aberrant individual August 25th (P.J.Holmes, P.Merchant, N.Odin et al).

REED BUNTING Emberiza schoeniclus

One March 14th. In autumn a total of 36 south & 11 on site September 22nd to November 15th, max. eight south October 28th. In December one south 3rd & one on 24th.

ESCAPEES

HARRIS HAWK Parabuteo unicinctus

Singles January 15th, September 13th, 24th & 25th.

HYBRID GYR/PEREGRINE Falco rusticolus/peregrinus

One May 2nd & 3rd was known to have been lost on landfill duties several weeks prior to this & was re-caught in Ipswich the week following these sightings.

COCKATIEL Nymphicus hollandicus

One May 22nd.

CANARY Serinus canaria

One south November 25th.

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
