SPARROWHAWK Accipiter nisus

Singles intermiantly January to early March. Spring passage at least from March 12th to May 19th, max. two. One June 21st. Up to two present August 6th to years end with three October 8th & November 10th.

MARSH HARRIER Circus aeruginosus

One south January 9th, two south April 8th, one south 13th, one north May 8th, one south June 1st, one south August 15th, one west September 25th, one north October 22nd & one south November 18th.

HEN HARRIER Circus cyaneus

Immature male south September 10th & 'ringtail' south November 19th.

**RED KITE** Milvus milvus

Two south March 17th & one south June 12th.

#### **BUZZARD** Buteo buteo

Noted on eight dates March 17th to June 20th and ten dates August 20th to December 14th, max. three April 18th.

**LITTLE OWL** *Athene noctua* 

One heard November 21st.

**SHORT-EARED OWL** *Asio flammeus* 

Singles March 16th, April 2nd, May 2nd & November 28th.

**BEE-EATER** Merops apiaster

One heard flying north June 18th (N.Odin).

**WRYNECK** *Jynx torquilla* 

One August 19th to 20th.

# **GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER** Dendrocopos major

Singles January 13th, March 20th & May 8th. In autumn singles on 25 dates June 21st to October 21st with two July 15th. Later bird November 12th.

#### **GREEN WOODPECKER** Picus viridis

Singles on 13 dates July 11th to August 12th plus two July 26th.

**KESTREL** Falco tinnunculus

One or two all year. One south May 5th. Dispersing juveniles from June 11th, max two. One south July 23rd, one west September 3rd, one south 10th, one south October 21st & one in off November 22nd.

#### **MERLIN** Falco columbarius

Singles October 23rd & 25th.

**HOBBY** Falco subbuteo

Singles June 8th, 12th, 27th, September 13th, 15th & October 14th.

**PEREGRINE** *Falco peregrinus* 

Present sporadically all year with few records May to September. Additionals bird January 4th & March 12th. Several sightings of dispersing juvs July 21st onwards.

**JAY** Garrulus glandarius

Singles April 9th, 17th, 19th & June 15th.

MAGPIE Pica pica

Present all year with four pairs nesting, two of these rearing three young, one pair two young & one pair one young but none of these are known to have survived to the years end. Spring max. 28 March 25th, summer peak 22 June 15th, August 7th & 10th with autumn max. 15 October 18th.

# JACKDAW Coloeus monedula

In spring total of 14 north 40 south 28 on site February 26th to June 9th, max. seven north three south March 14th. In autumn total of one south 15 on site September 21st to October 31st, max. nine October 29th.

**ROOK** Corvus frugilegus

In spring total of eight north 18 south March 14th to April 24th, max. seven north March 18th. In autumn one north 15 south September 27th to November 4th, max. ten south October 14th.

#### **CARRION CROW** Corvus corone

Present all year. Three pairs nested in the near adjoining dock rearing three, two + two young although only one of these young survived to the years end. Intruders occasionally turn up on site and are soon seen off by the locals. Spring max. 30 March 16th & 23 October 14th in autumn. Spring passage movements of 41 north 34 south March 13th to May 26th, max. four north 24 south March 24th. In autumn two south October 3rd.

WAXWING Bombycilla garrulus

One November 29th.

**COAL TIT** *Periparus ater britannicus* 

Eight noted June 1st to 11th, one July 10th & one October 11th.

MARSH TIT Poecile palustris

One June 16th (N.Odin *et al*). Sixth site record.

#### **BLUE TIT** *Cyanistes caeruleus*

Present all year with one pair nesting. Five birds from previous years survived the winter with the oldest from June 2019. Spring passage March 7th to April 14th plus a later new bird May 26th, max. five March 19th & 29th. First juvenile June 1st with dispersing juveniles from elsewhere June 5th to August 2nd. Autumn passage August 13th to November 2nd, max. 24 September 22nd.

# **GREAT TIT** Parus major

Present all year with four pairs nesting. Ten birds from previous years survived from previous years with the oldest from July 2017. Spring passage February 24th to April 9th, max. six. First juvenile May 24th with dispersing juveniles turning up on site from elsewhere from then to July 22nd, max. 20 June 8th. Autumn passage August 21st to October 26th, max. 18 October 16th.

#### WOODLARK Lullula arborea

In autumn 14 noted October 1st to October 28th, max three south October 8th, 9th & 14th.

#### **SKYLARK** Alauda arvensis

Spring passage total of 22 noted February 2nd to April 19th, max. two. Dispersing juveniles noted June 2nd, 22nd & August 2nd. Autumn passage total of 388 noted September 30th to December 15th, max. 69 south October 25th.

# SAND MARTIN Riparia riparia

Spring total of eight noted April 19th to May 13th, max. three May 1st. In autumn a total of 241 noted June 7th to September 11th, max. 55 south August 2nd.

# **SWALLOW** *Hirundo rustica*

Noted April 11th to November 26th. Spring max. one north 110 south May 10th. Autumn passage from at least July 13th, max. 395 south September 5th. Small numbers also occasionally loiter on site.

One November 12th.

SEDGE WARBLER Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

Spring singles May 2nd & 22nd. In autumn singles August 4th, 15th, 25th, September 10th, 11th & 13th.

#### **REED WARBLER** Acrocephalus scirpaceus

Spring passage May 4th to June 9th, max. two May 12th & 19th. In autumn July 22nd to September 16th, max. two August 25th.

**BLACKCAP** Sylvia atricapilla

Spring passage March 23rd to June 15th, max. 12 April 13th & 14th. Failed breeding adults from elsewhere turned up July 8th & 11th. At least 12 dispersing juveniles turned up June 23rd to July 26th with a couple staying to the start of autumn passage August 16th to November 11th, max. 20 September 10th & 40 11th the only double figure counts.

# GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

In spring singles May 2nd, 3rd & 12th. Autumn singles on 12 dates July 29th to September 30th & two September11th.

**LESSER WHITETHROAT** Curruca curruca

Spring passage April 18th to at least June 1st, max. 14 May 3rd. Five pairs bred with juveniles noted from June 21st. Autumn passage from at least end July to September 29th, max. 14 September 11th.

# WHITETHROAT Curruca communis

Spring passage April 13th to June 1st, max. six. Three pairs bred. Two birds from 2021 returned. Juveniles noted from June 26th. Autumn passage from at least July 8th to September 14th, max. seven August 16th.

# DARTFORD WARBLER Curruca undata

One October 29th & presumed same 31st.

FIRECREST Regulus ignicapilla

Spring passage March 12th to April 21st, max. three March 14th. Autumn passage October 19th to 25th, max. three 25th.

# **GOLDCREST** *Regulus regulus*

Spring passage singles March 8th, 19th, 21st & 23rd. Autumn passage September 19th to November 16th with one staying to 25th, max. 20 October 21st.

# **WREN** *Troglodytes troglodytes*

Present all year. At least seven survived from previous years with the oldest from July 2018. Spring passage March 6th to April 25th plus later new females June 2nd & 10th. Four or five pairs bred, with juveniles appearing from June 7th. Dispersing juveniles from elsewhere turned up on site from then to August 22nd. Autumn passage October 9th to November 21st with peak count of ten on seven dates October. **STARLING** *Sturnus vulgaris* 

Present all year, although few in the winter months. Spring max. 59 March 24th. One pair nested at cottage. Summer peaks of 700 June 22nd & 750 August 7th. Visible movements in autumn of 1,747 in off the sea or flying south October 10th to November 28th, max. 520 in/south October 30th.

#### **SONG THRUSH** *Turdus philomelos*

At least two over wintered with a new bird turning up February 2nd. Spring passage March 6th to May 5th, max. five March 6th. One pair bred rearing no young. Dispersing juveniles from elsewhere noted July 13th & 18th. Autumn passage September 10th to December 26th, max. ten September 25th, November 1st & 2nd.

# **MISTLE THRUSH** *Turdus viscivorus*

Singles January 19th, February 11th & March 13th. In autumn five singles noted October 20th to November 6th plus two November 19th.

#### **REDWING** *Turdus iliacus*

Singles January 6th & February 10th Spring passage March 10th to April 30th, max. 40 March 14th & 80 29th. Autumn passage September 24th to December 7th plus 12 later birds 27th, max. 27 October 4th.

# **BLACKBIRD** Turdus merula

At least 14 males 13 females survived the winter with the oldest from 2018. Present all year with 11 - 12 pairs nesting. New birds turned up January 15th & February 12th. Spring passage March 3rd to April 14th plus four new wandering first year males arriving May 25th to June 7th, max. day count 18 March 13th. First juvenile noted April 14th with dispersing juveniles turning up on site from then to July 30th. Autumn passage August 23rd to December 14th, max. 40 November 13th & 35 19th. **FIELDFARE** *Turdus pilaris* 

Noted on nine dates January to February 12th, max. seven January 4th. Spring passage singles on eight dates March 24th to May 3rd. Autumn passage October 15th to December 2nd plus two later birds 18th & one 27th, max. eight October 20th.

# **RING OUZEL** *Turdus torquatus*

Spring singles April 23rd to 30th & May 3rd. Autumn passage singles September 29th, October 1st, 20th & November 6th.

# **SPOTTED FLYCATCHER** *Muscicapa striata*

Spring passage May 12th to June 4th, max. five May 14th. Autumn passage singles September 11th & 13th.

# **ROBIN** Erithacus rubecula

13 birds are known to have successfully over-wintered on site, with the oldest from only May 2021. Spring passage March 3rd to May 22nd, max. eight March 29th. Four pairs bred. First juvenile noted May 16th with dispersing birds from elsewhere arriving on site from then to autumn passage from early August to November 18th, max. 30 October 21st. At least 12 birds attempting to winter December.

## NIGHTINGALE Luscinia megarhynchos

One May 10th. Juvenile June 11th & adult female 13th. Calls regularly heard from then until autumn passage with what is thought to be the juvenile staying to July 26th & the female, which was retrapped after moulting August 3rd. Additional new autumn passage juveniles July 27th & August 3rd.

# PIED FLYCATCHER Ficedula hypoleuca

Autumn passage August 10th to September 29th, max. two August 23rd & September 11th.

#### **BLACK REDSTART** *Phoenicurus ochruros*

Spring passage from March 13th, max. three March 30th. Male sang sporadically to May 31st. Singles June 26th, July 8th & 19th Autumn passage September 29th to November 14th, max. two November 4th.

#### **REDSTART** *Phoenicurus phoenicurus*

In spring singles April 6th, 13th & May 13th. Autumn passage singles on seven dates August 13th to September 30th with two September 11th & 13th.

# WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra

One May 3rd & two 14th. Autumn passage August 10th to September 13th, max. seven September 11th.

# **STONECHAT** Saxicola rubicola

None in spring. Singles August 7th & September 5th predated autumn total of a further 13 September 20th to November 4th, max. two November 2nd.

### WHEATEAR Oenanthe oenanthe

Spring passage April 4th to June 10th, max. 21 April 13th & 22 May 14th. Autumn passage August 3rd to November 12th, max. 16 September 11th.

# **TREE SPARROW** *Passer montanus*

# One September 27th.

# HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

Present all year with 30 pairs nesting at the cottage and Fort. Only four birds retrapped from previous years with the oldest from May 2019. The year's peak count was 120 August 21st, September 9th & October 13th.

#### **DUNNOCK** Prunella modularis

At least 12 birds successfully survived the winter, with the oldest from October 2017. Present all year with at least 12 pairs nesting. Spring passage very poor March 7th to at least 18th. 30 counted April 19th, First juveniles noted May 26th with dispersing juveniles turning up on site from then to August 18th. Autumn passage at least September 2nd to at least October 12th, max. 25 on several dates.

#### YELLOW WAGTAIL Motacilla flava

Total of 16 noted April 17th to May 19th, max. three may 15th & 19th. Autumn passage total of 46 July 17th to September 21st, max. ten south September 12th.

# GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea

In spring nine noted February 22nd to May 21st, max. two May 21st. Seven noted mid-summer June 25th to July 27th. In autumn a total of 90 noted August 20th to November 14th, max. 11 September 20th.

# PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba

Present all year. At least four pairs nested in the near adjoining dock with these birds and their offspring regularly on site, max 35 August 16th. In autumn a total of 35 south October 2nd to November 19th, max. nine south October 8th.

WHITE WAGTAIL Motacilla alba alba

Singles on six dates March 15th to May 18th & one September 20th.

# **MEADOW PIPIT** Anthus pratensis

One south January 29th & three south February 9th. Spring passage March 3rd to May 2nd, max 12 north one on March 28th. In summer one south July 13th, one south 19th & one on August 6th. Autumn passage August 21st to December 1st with later on two 24th & one 26th, max. 338 south plus 30 on site September 12th & 235 south October 2nd.

One from January 11th sporadically to February 12th. Spring passage February 22nd to April 2nd, max. two. In autumn a total of 24 bird-days September 18th to December 1st plus later birds 11th & 13th, max.two.

# **CHAFFINCH** *Fringilla coelebs*

One or two January to February 10th. Spring passage February 23rd to May 25th, max. four April 9th. Two flew north March 23rd & two south April 6th. Dispersing juveniles June 7th, 13th, 16th, July 10th & 24th. Autumn passage September 4th to November 29th with a total of six north 371 south/in off the sea, max. 35 in/south October 14th & 33 in off November 8th. Autumn max. of grounded birds was 12 November 4th. One noted on site in December with two 1st.

#### BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla

Spring passage total of 23 February 22nd to May 12th, max. three March 21st. Autumn passage total of 24 noted September 19th to November 29th, max. five October 20th.

# HAWFINCH Coccothraustes coccothraustes

One March 23rd with plucked remains found 24th probably predated by Sparrowhawk

# **BULLFINCH** *Pyrrhula pyrrhula*

Singles March 26th, & November 5th.

# **GREENFINCH** Chloris chloris

Noted all year except January. Spring max. four March 9th & April 4th. Two south May 15th. In autumn visible migration total of 89 south September 20th to November 26th, max. 14 south October 25th with autumn max. on site six October 10th, 13th & 21st. Last noted December 15th.

**LINNET** *Linaria cannabina* 

Two January 1st then noted all year from January 24th, with an early year max. 45 February 28th. Numbers increased from end February. Spring max. of 100 April 25th, 26th & May 2nd. An estimated 30 pairs nested with several more nearby. 23 adults retrapped from previous years, with the oldest from May 2018. Summer max. count 110 June 22nd. Autumn total of 1,494 south October 2nd to November 26th, max. 380 south October 22nd. December max. five 14th.

# **COMMON REDPOLL** Acanthis flammea

Singles October 25th, 26th & November 5th.

# **LESSER REDPOLL** Acanthis cabaret

None in spring. In autumn total of 591 noted September 24th to November 29th, max. 115 November 10th.

# **GOLDFINCH** Carduelis carduelis

Present all year. Up to five present January to early March. Four birds from previous years noted during the breeding season from 2020. Visible migration total in spring of 74 south March 28th to May 25th, max. 11 south April 5th. One pair bred with young from May 31st. Summer peak of 45 June 22nd. Autumn visible passage total of 8,521 south September 14th to November 29th, max. 1,280 south October 25th with an autumn max. of grounded birds 36 October 13th. Later in the year max ten December 1st.

# **SERIN** Serinus serinus

Singles April 5th (P.J.Denyer *et al*), May 7th (N.Odin *et al*) & June 10th (W.J.Brame, P.J.Holmes, N.Odin *et al*).

# **SISKIN** Spinus spinus

In spring a total of 39 noted March 10th to May 1st, max. ten south March 16th. In summer two June 7th, one 21st, one 24th, one July 12th & five August 2nd. Autumn total of 477 September 11th to November 26th, max. 137 south November 10th.

LAPLAND BUNTING Calcarius lapponicus

Singles south October 4th & November 19th.

**SNOW BUNTING** *Plectrophenax nivalis* 

One October 8th to 10th, three November 5th & one 9th to 21st.

# YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

One February 23rd, one March 15th & one April 9th. In autumn two south November 21st & two south 26th.

#### **REED BUNTING** *Emberiza schoeniclus*

In spring two March 9th, one 15th, one 21st & one May 7th. In autumn a total of 32 noted September 24th to November 12th, max. four October 6th, 7th & 25th. Later bird December 24th.
